The Six Main Beliefs

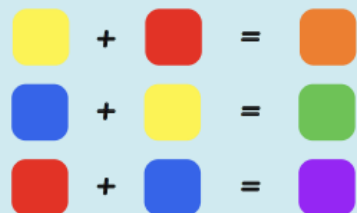
- Belief in **Allah** as the one and only God. They believe **Allah** is the only ruler of the universe. The word '**Islam**' means submission and obedience to **Allah**.

- Belief in the Day of Judgement (when **Allah** decides if a person goes to heaven or hell).

Pilgrimage	A pilgrimage is a sacred journey, undertaken for a spiritual purpose.	Allah	The Arabic name that Muslims use for God.	The main Muslim festivals are: Ramadan, Eid – Al – Fitr and Eid – al – Adha. During Ramadan , Muslims try to give up bad habits and become better Muslims by praying more. They fast during the daylight and only eat after the sun has set.
Islam		Muhammad	The last, and most important, prophet in Islam . Muhammad is so highly respected by Muslims that they will say ‘peace be upon him’ after his name is spoken.

Key Questions

What is an algorithm? Why is it useful in coding?

An algorithm is a step-by-step set of instructions used to solve a problem or achieve an objective.

A clear algorithm can help you to create code that does what it is supposed to do.

Can you explain what the repeat command and the timer command do?

A repeat command will repeat actions a specified number of times.

A timer will repeat every time the timer fires this could be **every** 4 seconds or **after** a certain number of seconds.

If you are good at coding, you don't need to debug. Is this true?

All coders need to debug to make sure that their program works correctly, and the code does what they intended. As you get better at coding, your programs will get more complex and debugging gets even **more** important.
