<u>Online Relationships</u> I can recognise some ways in which the internet can be used to communicate. I can give examples of how I (might) use technology to communicate with people I know.	<u>Online Reputation</u> I can recognise that information can stay online and could be copied.
<u>Online Reputation</u> I can identify ways that I can put information on the internet.	<u>Managing Online Information</u> I can talk about how to use the internet as a way of finding information online. I can give simple examples of how to find information using digital technologies (e.g. search engines, voice activated searching). I can use simple keywords in search engines. I can demonstrate how to navigate a simple webpage to get to information I need (e.g. home, forward, back buttons; links, tabs and sections).
<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can explain how some people may have devices in their homes connected to the internet and give examples (e.g. lights, fridges, toys, televisions).	<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can explain how passwords are used to protect information, accounts and devices.
<u>Copyright and Ownership</u> I can name my work so that others know it belongs to me. I can save my work under a suitable title or name so that others know it belongs to me (e.g. filename, name on content).	<u>Copyright and Ownership</u> I understand that work created by others does not belong to me even if I save a copy.

<u>Self-Image and Identity</u> I can explain how identity online can be copied, modified or altered.	<u>Online Reputation</u> I can explain how to search for information about others online. <u>Online Bullying</u> I can describe appropriate ways to behave towards other people online and why this is important.	<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can explain how many free apps or services may read and share private information (e.g. friends, contacts, likes, images, videos, voice, messages, geolocation) with others.	<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can describe how connected devices can collect and share anyone's information with others. I can describe how and why people should keep their software and apps up to date (e.g. auto updates).	<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can describe strategies for keeping personal information private, depending on the context. I can describe simple ways to increase privacy on apps and services that provide privacy settings.
<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can describe simple strategies for creating and keeping passwords private. I can explain what a strong password is and demonstrate how to create one. I can explain what to do if a password is shared, lost or stolen.	<u>Privacy and Security</u> I can give reasons why someone should only share information with people they choose to and trust. I can explain that if they are not sure or feel pressured then they should tell a trusted adult.	<u>Managing Online Information</u> I can explain the benefits and limitations of using different search engines (e.g. voice activation). I can explain how some technology can limit the information I am presented with.	<u>Copyright and Ownership</u> I can demonstrate how to make references to and acknowledge sources I have used from the internet.

	I can describe effective ways people can manage passwords (e.g. storing them securely or saving them in the browser).	<u>Copyright and Ownership</u> I can demonstrate the use of search tools to find and access online content which can be reused by others.	<u>Managing Online Information</u> I can explain what autocomplete is and how to choose the best suggestion.
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
