Who Are Muslims and What Do They Believe?

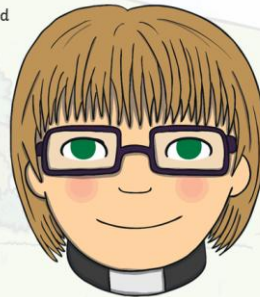
- Muslims believe that the words of The Qur'an were revealed to a prophet called Muhammad (PBUH).
- A prophet is a kind of messenger. Muslims believe that Allah sent Muhammad (PBUH) to spread the message of Islam to the world.
- **Did You Know...?** Muslims hold the name of The Prophet in such high regard that they say 'Peace Be Upon Him' after his name.



Christening

A christening is when a baby is welcomed into the Christian faith. The baby's parents and friends all go to a church service.

A person who leads a church is sometimes called a priest or a vicar. At the start of the christening, the vicar will welcome people to the church and then read something from the Bible.



Shabbat: A Special Time

Shabbat is a very special time for Jewish people. They believe that God created the world in six days and on the seventh day He had a rest.

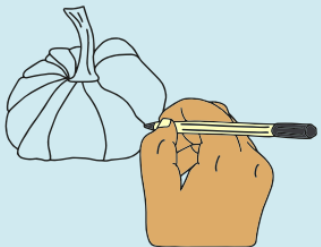

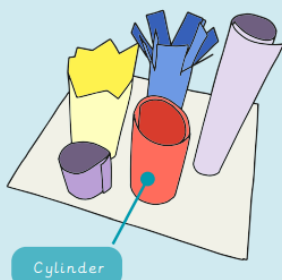
Tree of life

3D - can be held, like a cylinder



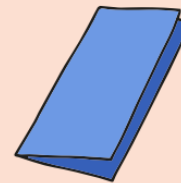

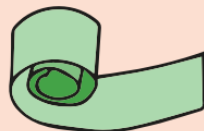

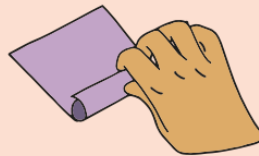

Assemble	To fix all parts together.
Design	To make, draw or write plans for something.
Design criteria	A set of rules to help you with your ideas and test the success of them.
Evaluation	When you look at the good and bad points about something, then think about how you could improve it.
Mechanism	A system of parts working together.
Model	A practise version, often on a smaller scale, that lets you test out your idea and see how it will look and work.
Sliders	Something that can move from side to side or up and down.
Stencil	A shape which you can draw around.
Target audience	A person or particular group of people at whom a product is aimed.
Template	A stencil which you use to help you draw a shape more easily on to different materials.
Test	To find out whether something works as it should.

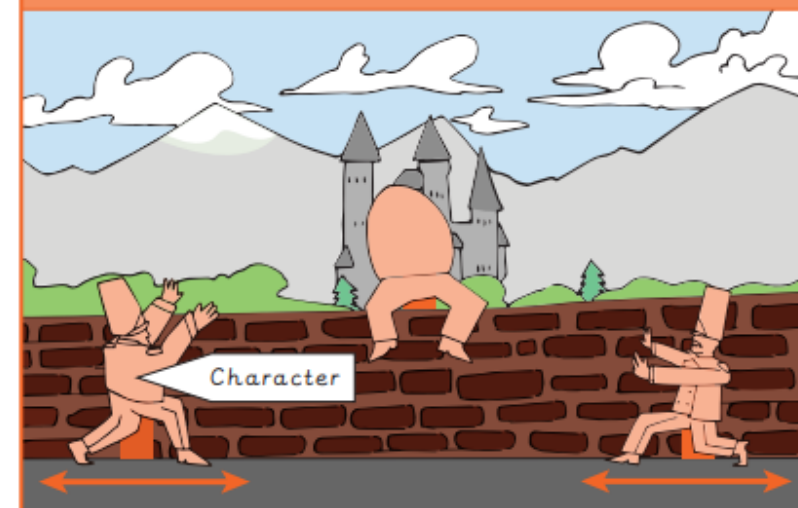

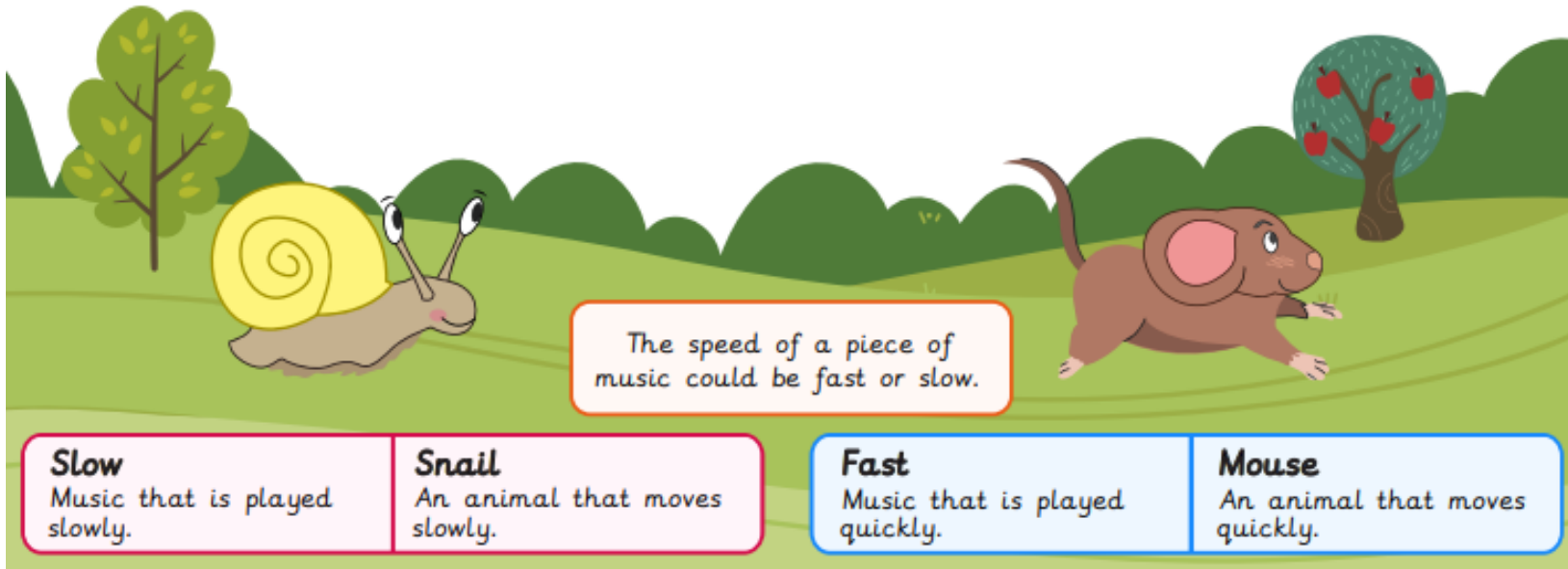

Animation

An object that moves on screen.

Background

An image inserted into a file that sits behind text, objects, or buttons.

Clip-art Gallery

A place in software such as 2Create a Story where a library of images can be found and inserted into a file.

E-book

A book that can be read on the computer or on a tablet.

Edit

Edit means to change something. For example, change some text to improve it.

Font

The style of text used in a piece of writing on a computer or tablet.

Sound

Sounds can be uploaded into software from a file or created.

Sound Effect

A sound other than speech or music made for use in a play, film or computer file.

Text

Words, letters, numbers or symbols entered into a computer, such as writing text in 2Create a Story.

Algorithm

A precise, step-by-step set of instructions used to solve a problem or achieve an objective.

Challenge

A task to be completed.

Command

An action such as left command.

Instruction

Detailed information about how something should be done or operated.

Left and Right

A position which relates to something. For example, make the fish move left of the screen.

Direction

The path that something travels. For example, a robot moving forwards, backwards or diagonal.

Undo

If we make a mistake, we can press the undo button.

Unit

A unit such as make the turtle move 2 units (squares).

Route

A path an object or thing takes to get somewhere.

- To understand the functionality of the direction keys.
- To understand how to create and debug a set of instructions (algorithm).
- To use the additional direction keys as part of an algorithm.
- To understand how to change and extend the algorithm list.
- To create a longer algorithm for an activity.
- To set challenges for peers.
- To access peer challenges set by the teacher as 2Dos.
